G & M's first 'hat' trick was the creation of a trio of villas known as Bali Bali: petite Bali Bali Cottage, three-bedroom Bali Bali One and two-bedroom Bali Bali Two. Together, these unique structures can sleep up to 15 guests, offering a variety of renting options as each has its own private entrance (and separate pool).

Inside, the organically-shaped walls and low roofs serve to create cozy nooks within open-plan living areas, while gorgeous rural vistas can be glimpsed from the most unexpected corners. TV viewing takes place on snug attic-like mezzanines, and intriguing passageways lead to romantic, somewhat rustic, bedrooms. Outside, primitive statues stand guard beside lily ponds, vast gardens roll down to the rice fields, and a quirky, half-moon swimming pool beckons. The villas are nestled peacefully within an enchanting rural enclave only ten minutes' drive from the beach and a few kilo metres from sophisticated Seminyak.

As the end of your holiday draws near, it's got to be worth conjuring that rabbit out of its favorite haunt and begging for an extension.

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
